Dampiera stricta



Or Blue Dampiera is a small erect herb about 20 to 40 cm high and is often overlooked as it is often found under other plants. The colour varies from blue to dark mauve. It is in flower from spring to early summer.

Third Cemetery

From the Sydney Morning Herald 24 April 1900



Jeannie Thomson, only 16 years and 9 months old

“THE BUBONIC PLAGUE. Several cases yesterday, Dr. Thompson on the situation.

Yesterday's list of bubonic plague cases is a long one, comprising eight patients, though one of them rightly belongs to Sunday. It was not, however, reported, to the Board of Health until yesterday. The name of this patient was Jeannie Thomson, who resided at Chippendale. She was, after her illness, taken to the Sydney Hospital, and died there before she could be removed. Another patient, Miss Mary Newton, resided at Annandale; a third, Mrs. Esther Fuller, resided at Redfern. The fourth patient is named Percy Cook, of the city. In his case there is an unusually large number of "contacts," approaching 100 in number. This patient was taken to the Sydney Hospital for treatment, as was also James Munn, another resident in the city. They were there found to be plague-stricken. The sixth patient, John Linklater,

also resided in the city. The seventh patient, who is also dead, was a Chinese, named Gooney Gooney, who went to Prince Alfred Hospital for treatment, and died there.

The last patient is named Ephraim Thomson. He resided on the border of Summer Hill and Ashfield.



Dr. Salter's report of the state of the patients under his charge in the quarantine hospital mentions several who are very ill. The greater numbers are, however, improving. It is likely that the names of a dozen convalescents will be submitted to the Board of Health to-day as being fit for release. They have quite recovered from their illnesses.”

On 22 May 1900 James Munn died from bubonic plague, his doctor was. Dr A E Salter.
