SIGNS OF PROGRESS ON NORTH HEAD SANCTUARY



The North Head Sanctuary Foundation (NHSF) has warmly welcomed the erection of a new sign at the entrance to North Head, which brands the iconic site as simply the “North Head Sanctuary”

NHSF Committee member Dr Geoff Lambert said that the sign was “tremendous symbolism” and one which was being backed by real progress on the ground.

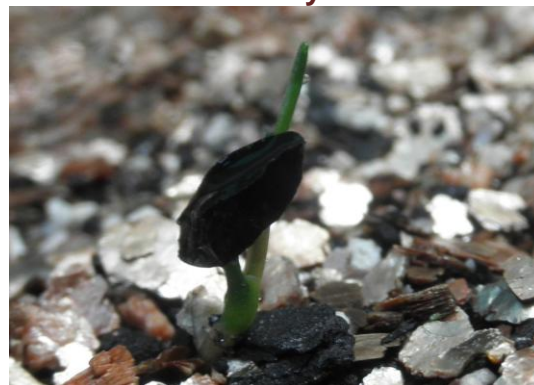
“It is fair to say that Indigenous people managed this area as a unified ‘sanctuary’ from the time of the last Ice Age. We Europeans took our first lessons on how to manage land with fire on North Head within weeks of the arrival of the First Fleet.”

“Since 1788, Europeans have ‘sliced and diced’ North Head repeatedly. Now, in the 21st Century, we have 8 separate ‘stakeholders’ who are responsible for caring for the land there.”

Geoff says it is a sign of the stakeholders' commitment to the idea of a North Head Sanctuary that they all agreed to the sign being of the simplest and most logo-free form. At last they are presenting North Head as it ought to be presented - a sanctuary valued for its own sake and not who controls it.

Geoff said that good progress was being made on turning the concept of the Sanctuary into real results “on the ground”. He said that visitors to North Head were reporting increased numbers of wildlife, including echidnas and the newly reintroduce Bogul native bush rat.

Help climate science Enjoy the natural beauty of North Head

NHSF will be conducting ClimateWatch guided walks on the first Sunday of each month from March to June.

An initiative of Earthwatch, and developed with the Bureau of Met. and University of Melbourne, ClimateWatch is a citizen science program in which people in their local communities gather information about the influences of temperature and rainfall on plant and animal behaviour. North Head is one of the ClimateWatch key monitoring sites, and the Foundation is assisting the program here. More info about ClimateWatch at www.climatewatch.org.au.

Third Cemetery

In loving memory of our dear sister, Alice Lawler.

On 1 May 1900 Alice Lawler died of the Bubonic plague at her home at 160 Walker St., Redfern, as she was too ill to be removed. Her body was brought here for burial. Minister was Rev Ignatius. She was 24 years old.

Lillian Conyers, Alice's niece, a little child, 4 years of age was living with her aunt at the time of her death. Lillian was removed to quarantine on 3 May as a suspected case of Bubonic plague.

However Lillian Jane Conyers she recovered and married Alfred John Harry in 1919, but died on 10 June 1919, aged 23, at Royal North Shore Hospital.

Back in Time

The Sydney Morning Herald 5 October 1936

“NORTH HEAD FIRE.

The fire in the scrub on the old quarantine reserve at North Head made a spectacular blaze. Fanned by a light north-easterly breeze, fires which had smouldered earlier in the day broke out fiercely about 6 p.m., and the services of several men of the Royal Artillery from George's Heights and from the Manly and Crow's Nest fire brigades under District officer Spring were rushed to the scene. Several breaks were made, and the flames were kept in check. They raged round the old cemetery on the Quarantine Reserve, and spread towards the North Head garrison buildings, but their onset was blocked by a solid stone wall. The lurid glare attracted many sightseers, and from the heights overlooking Manly the flames presented a striking scene.”

Or Kangaroo

Grass is one of the most widely distributed native grasses in Australia and is found on North Head. It is recognised by its distinctive brown and reddish-purple spikelet clusters. We have grown this grass in the Nursery as habitat for the bandicoots.
